WHAT WE BELIEVE

The Nonprofit Partnership is in the performance improvement business. Of the many ways we might go about working with nonprofit leaders in our region to enhance effectiveness, which are the most successful? This is what we believe:

- » A robust menu of education and training that engages our membership through face-to-face contact that builds relationships and stimulates the desire to change is the foundation of our work. With that in mind, we offer a variety of skill development workshops in a variety of formats based on the interests and needs of our member organizations.
- » While these learning opportunities boost engagement and stimulate the desire to enhance an organization's capacity, the opportunity to grow and change often comes about through focused one-to-one work between organizational leadership and staff of or consultants facilitated by The Nonprofit Partnership. Up to six hours of consultation, plus the resources available by application through our grants program, presents the opportunity to translate knowledge into practice that advances mission.
- » In an age where nearly two-thirds of all nonprofit revenue is linked to consumer choice and donors and grant makers routinely review an organization's online profile prior to investing, an organization's online presence is just as important as its physical presence. The center of your online universe is still your organization's website, so we offer information, technical assistance, and grant funding to enhance and improve websites and online communications.
- » Leadership is essential. The pressures on nonprofits today, with increased demand for services and diminishing resources for support, require talented and energetic leaders. We believe that an effective leadership development

program is supported by three pillars: the capacity to articulate your cause in a compelling way, the capacity to network effectively and build teams dedicated to the cause, and the vision to navigate effectively in a complex management environment.

The programs and services we offer are a reflection of this worldview. We look forward to continuing to engage you and challenge you in the year ahead as we harness all of these strategies to advance the nonprofit community in our region.





WHAT WE OFFER

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

A cornerstone of The Nonprofit Partnership's annual offerings to members, our menu of free education and training sessions is being delivered in an increasing variety of formats by experts in management, governance, fundraising, and marketing. Morning workshops on high-interest, in-demand topics still lead the way, but they are

complemented by labs and discussion groups where the material is reviewed prior to the session, full-day product labs where participants produce a marketing plan, mini-grant, logic model, or event plan in a single session with coaching, and online content packages in print and video.

Each fall, The Nonprofit Partnership presents its Northwest Pennsylvania Nonprofit Day conference, a full day of learning and networking that is attended by over 400 nonprofit leaders from throughout the region. Plenary sessions featuring national nonprofit figures, three rounds of engaging workshops, a vendor fair, and networking opportunities throughout the day, have traditionally made this a highlight of the year for member organizations.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

To foster the development of strong nonprofit leaders, The Nonprofit Partnership facilitates leadership circles that meet monthly throughout the year. Groups of up to 8 executive directors meet monthly to discuss challenges, trade insights, build skills, and reduce their isolation. Individual coaching and the development of a strong peer network enhance the value for CEOs who want to build leadership capacity by strengthening their abilities to articulate, to network, and to navigate artfully in our challenging management landscape.

New in 2014, we are extending leadership development opportunities to development directors through a new peer circle. To strengthen organizational leadership by increasing the synergy between board chairs and CEOs, The Nonprofit Partnership is also offering the experience retreat for leadership with regional and national leaders in governance to offer the inspiration, the guidance, and the focused time needed for these leadership pairs to forge dynamic relationships and plans.







GET CONNECTED VOLUNTEER CENTER

Get Connected Erie is Erie County's online volunteer center, a web portal that serves as a place where organizational skill needs can be met with the skills, time, and passion of our region's many volunteers. Launched in 2011 through a partnership with United Way of Erie County, this online

volunteer center is managed by The Nonprofit Partnership and serves as a resource for boosting volunteerism throughout the county.

The Get Connected website resources are amplified by volunteer recruitment campaigns that we conduct throughout the year to generate more support of all types from all types of people that can help our members achieve their missions. Technical assistance for member nonprofits in adopting best practices in volunteer recruitment, management, and retention is another resource to help Erie County maximize the potential of volunteerism that exists in our region.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRATEGY

A critical element in finding ways to stay relevant and vital, The Nonprofit Partnership offers a variety of resources that clarify, refocus, and sharpen organizational strategies. Free consultation that comes with organizational membership is used by many members to conduct board retreats, strategic planning sessions, or business plan tune-ups that help organizations align mission with money.

For extended work with industry-specific experts that can help members develop detailed multi-year strategies and action plans or assist them with the development of partnerships and plans for future organizational leadership, or simply plan and execute needed advocacy strategies, capacity-building grants are offered twice annually through which members can contract with chosen consultants or can team consultants into a comprehensive package of turnaround support for an organization.

COMMUNICATIONS AND MARKETING SUPPORT

When marketing efforts are fragmented and inconsistent among different communication channels, the **Communications Makeover** package of services helps to unify the brand and message and provide the nonprofit with a cohesive strategy that includes both online and offline marketing vehicles. Over the years, members have used the Makeover package to re-examine





their organizational brand, develop a compelling message strategy, and enhance or launch new websites that accurately portray the services and identity of the organization.

Support is also offered for additional tools that help members with their identity and marketing work. Video story campaigns can be the centerpiece of a development strategy and can add a tool that channels emotion to power fund development or the recruitment of volunteers. An organization can also add to its appeal through upgrading its signage and the way in which its entryway and reception areas model the organization's brand and tell its story. Matching support for these marketing tools is available on an ongoing basis from The Nonprofit Partnership.

OTHER ACTIVITIES OF THE NONPROFIT PARTNERSHIP

- » Offers training for board service for diverse leaders from Erie's neighborhoods through Project Blueprint.
- » Hosts the Erie-based support and training activities for the Lake Effect Leaders, the northwest Pennsylvania VISTA program.
- » Serves as staff to the Erie Community Fund Drives Committee, offering technical assistance in the design of capital campaigns.

HOW IT MAKES A DIFFERENCE / OUR RESULTS IN 2013

At The Nonprofit Partnership, we believe that when consistently pursued, the capacity-building strategies we offer translate into better organizational performance that shows up in:

A HEALTHIER FINANCIAL BOTTOM LINE

It's no secret that it's hard to have a healthy bottom line these days. Cuts in government funding, the lingering recession, and competition for the donor dollar have all conspired to help drive operating deficits for nonprofits in recent years. Last year, in fact, more nonprofits in our region lost money than made money. The healthcare sector, after a string of robust years, struggled last year. Government cuts took another bite. But in opposition to the national trend where larger nonprofits are doing better than smaller ones, Erie County's small nonprofits with budgets under \$1 million annually are outperforming their larger counterparts. Half of the small nonprofits had surpluses last year whereas only 40 percent of large nonprofits did. We believe that good management and governance results in better financial management, more effective fundraising, and a greater capacity to leverage volunteers. Two of every three members of The Nonprofit Partnership are small nonprofits, doing their best in challenging times and holding their own, comparatively, in the economy.

A MORE ROBUST ONLINE PRESENCE

With our websites as the center of our online universe, clients, donors, and stakeholders of all kinds are looking at them for evidence of our health and vitality. As one measure of organizational health, The Nonprofit Partnership assesses the

quality of its members' websites annually on an original 13-point quality rubric. Through the Communications Makeover program, consultation and technical assistance, education, and information sharing about best practices, resources to constantly improve websites are always within reach.



During the past year,

NPP member organizations raised their average scores for website content, quality, and navigability by eight percent over the previous year.

SPECIFIC COMPETENCIES AND CAPACITIES GAINED

By using a set of original organizational assessment scales, members who engage in specific activities to improve governance, fund development, marketing, or evaluation can demonstrate specific improvements over the course of the year, and leadership circle participants rate themselves with respect to attainment of personal goals. Last year, 85 percent of organizations who received capacity-building support in multiple areas from NPP demonstrated added competencies, while leadership program participants reported that they achieved over 90 percent of their personal goals.
